As the final race takes place on a permitted Highway track, placards are placed on the race track. There are sign boards after every 15 meters on an average to guide the racer to the destination.









NIT-J techies' car wins Indo-Asian solar challenge

JAMSHEDPUR: A solar cardeveloped by techies at the National Institute of Technology, Jamshedpur (MIT-J), has won the 2016 Indo-Asian Solar Challenge held at Lovely Professional University Jalandhar, after completing 62 laps of 1.26 km each, with a maximum speed of 40 kmph.

The prototype car, devel oped by the 25-member 'RAYS' team, was declared the winner of the championship, with over 252 teams participating in the competition, held from April 48.

The idea of the competition was to make solar vehicles commercially viable and usable in the

transport sector. With depleting reserves of fossil fuels, we need to shift to renewable and alternate sources of energy Solar energy is abundant and can be the answer to this riddle while also protecting the ecology," said Jitendra Kumar, team vice-captain.

The car is a three-wheel delta structured vehicle, with a hub motor in its rear wheel, which eliminates the transmission system It has a lithium-ion rechargeable battery which reduces its weight to 123 kg (without the driver), which made it the second lightest car in the competition.

"What is unique about our solar car is its innovation - the water sprinkler method - which automatically sprinkles water

over the solar panel whenever the solar panel gets heated to over than 70 degrees Celsius. This cools down the solar panel, which is crucial because an increase in each degree beyond 70 degrees decreases the efficiency of the solar panel by 0.5 %," Aditya Kumar, the team captain, told HT.

"Other features which were appreciated were the sear belt sensor - which compels the driver to wear the seat belt for each rick and the smoke sensor — whereby a buzzer starts ringing whenever there is a short-circuit." Shubham Joshi, another team member said.

The ream's accolades come soon after another team of techies won an international aircraft designing competition in Texas, US.
